

major shifts in instruction:

Language Arts:

- More complex texts
- Use of text evidence
- Balance of fiction and non-fiction texts

Math:

- More focus on fewer topics
- Linking topics across grades
- Multiple strategies

With these shifts come new teaching methods which can be frustrating for parents not accustomed to these new methods; especially in math. Report Card Changes



For parents of 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students, you will notice a new report card to accompany the new curriculum. No longer will your child receive “letter grades” for the content areas, rather a number that signifies how well your child is progressing toward

the content standards. It will not be uncommon to see lower scores at this point in the year, as the content standards are end of the year goals. Please make sure you attend your child's parent/teacher conference to learn more about how your child
